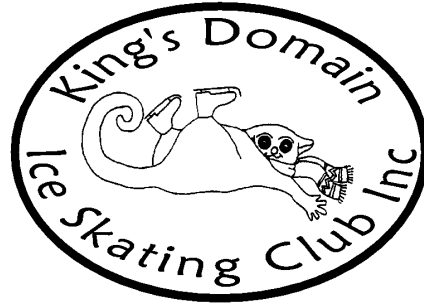

## ***About the Competition***

---

The 2010 Masters Cup and Adult Interpretative Trophy is a figure skating competition designed specifically for adult skaters aged 18 years or over and caters for all levels, from beginners to ex-elite skaters.

This year for the first time, Master's Cup is incorporating the nationally recognised ISA Adult skating divisions and rules as well as the International Judging System (IJS). In addition, we have added 2 lower level divisions called Proficiency and Copper, for those whose skills are not yet at Bronze level.

The Artistic divisions for Adult Interpretative Trophy remain essentially unchanged and will not be judged by the IJS. *Please note that the time restrictions have changed.*

In line with ISA rules, all Competitors must be a financial member of a skating club in order to participate in this competition. ***If you wish to join Kings Domain Ice Skating Club***, application forms will be available on the day or can be obtained from any of the following people: Billy Schober, Kathy Molnar or Katherine Molnar.

***Sole-Entry***

If you're the only entrant in a division, you will (in most cases) be offered the opportunity of performing the moves for the judges. If you reach the specified standard, you qualify for the "winner's" award.

## ***Entry Fees\****

---

***A limit of 3 entries per skater will be accepted.*** For example, you may enter one Masters Event, one Adult Interpretative Trophy Solo event and one Adult Interpretative Trophy Team event and/ or one Adult Interpretative duo event.

You **may not enter** 3 Masters Divisions *eg.* Bronze, Silver, Gold.  
All fees are inclusive of GST.

## ***Late Fees***

---

Late entries may be accepted but will be at the Convenors discretion. A late fee of \$50 **will** apply if Entries are received after 5pm Friday 21st May 2010.

***A late fee will also apply if changes to entries are made after this deadline.***

## ***Draws***

---

The draws for warm-ups and skating orders will be held **on Sunday, 6<sup>th</sup> June at the Olympic Ice Skating Centre commencing at 12 p.m.**

**The Solo interpretive event will be split by age. The age categories will be as follows:**  
18-25 years  
25- 40 years  
40 -55 years  
55+

Combined ladies and men events will be run.

## *Withdrawal*

If you must withdraw from the competition, you should advise the **Competition Convenor as soon as possible**. A refund is possible only on presentation of a medical certificate. **An administration fee of \$20 will** be retained from all refunds.

## *Judges*

---

There will be separate judging panels for Master's and Artistic Interpretive Trophy events.

There will be no Video Replay for Master's Cup or Adult Interpretive Trophy

## *Music*

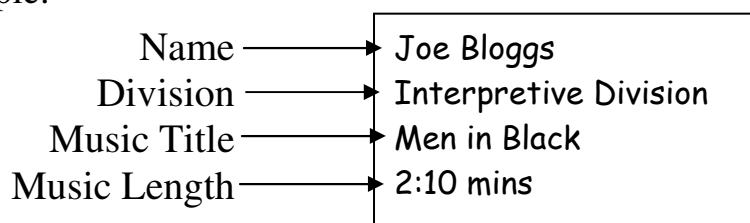
---

Competitors may use vocal or instrumental music for both Master's Cup and Adult Interpretive Trophy events.

All competitors shall provide music on **CASSETTE TAPE or CD**.

Cassette/CD **must** contain only **ONE** track and **must be clearly marked** with the following information:

**Tape must be fully rewound and without a cover**

## *Props / Costume*

---

Any props may be used, as long as they do not disrupt other competitor's performances. For example, props which require lengthy set up times, or result in feathers or other items being left on the ice will not be allowed. To ensure that props are appropriate, you must check with the Competition Convenor that your props are appropriate **BEFORE** the competition. The Competition Convenor has the right to have props that are not appropriate removed at any time.

There are no rules concerning the type of costume worn in any of the divisions - subject to public decency of course.

---

# ***REQUIRED ELEMENTS / RESTRICTIONS***

---

**PROFICIENCY**                      Duration: must not exceed 1 minute 40 seconds.

A well-balanced **PROFICIENCY** programme must show the skater's ability to use edges, turns and other skating movements to interpret music. No specific jumps or spins are required.

- Optional elements to include: spirals, attitudes, pivots, jumps and spins.
- Jumps: restricted to ½ revolution jumps.
- Spins: restricted to two foot spins or one foot stork spins only.

**COPPER**                              Duration: must not exceed 1 minute 40 seconds.

A well-balanced **COPPER** programme must contain a **maximum of 4 elements**:

- A **maximum of two (2) jump elements**. Only waltz, salchow, toe loop and ½ revolution jumps or less are permitted. Jumps may be performed as combinations or sequences. Any solo jump can be repeated only once and this repetition can be done either alone, in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.
- A **maximum of two (2) spins**. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for a spin with only one position, only basic spins may be performed. Two foot spins may be performed
- A **maximum of one (1) step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) or spiral sequence** covering up to 50% of the usual pattern.

**BRONZE**                              Duration: must not exceed 1 minute 40 seconds.

A well-balanced **BRONZE** programme must contain a **maximum of 7 elements**:

- A **maximum of four (4) jump elements**. Only single jumps are permitted, no Axel type jumps can be included. A jump combination may consist of the same or another single jump. There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or sequences. One jump combination could consist of up to three (3) listed jumps; the other two combinations must only consist of two (2) jumps each.
- A **maximum of two (2) spins of different abbreviations**. Flying spins are not permitted. The spins performed must have a required number of revolutions: three (3) for spin in one position and no change of foot, four (4) for spin combination with no change of foot, eight (4+4) for spin combination with a change of foot.
- A **maximum of one (1) step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) or spiral sequence** covering at least 50% of the usual pattern. In case of a circular step sequence a full circle is required covering ½ the width of the ice surface. In order for the Technical Panel to award above Level 1 for step or spiral sequence, they must fully utilise the ice surface.

## SILVER

Duration: must not exceed 2 minutes 10 seconds.

A well-balanced **SILVER** programme must contain a **maximum of 9 elements**:

- A **maximum of five (5) jump elements**. The single Axel or any other single Axel type jump and all other single jumps are permitted. Must include at least one jump combination or sequence of jumps, but not more than three in total. One jump combination could consist of up to three jumps; the other two combinations must only consist of two jumps each. Any solo jump can be repeated only once and this repetition must be done either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.
- A **maximum of three (3) spins of different abbreviations**, one of which must be a spin combination with an optional change of foot. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for a flying spin with no change of foot after landing, three (3) for a spin with only one position and no change of foot, four (4) for the spin combination with no change of foot and eight (4+4) for the spin combination with a change of foot.
- A **maximum of one (1) step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) or spiral sequence** covering at least 50% of the usual pattern. In case of a circular step sequence a full circle is required covering  $\frac{1}{2}$  the width of the ice surface. In order for the Technical Panel to award above Level 1 for step or spiral sequence, they must fully utilise the ice surface.

## GOLD

Duration: must not exceed 2 minutes 40 seconds.

A well-balanced **GOLD** programme must contain a **maximum of 10 elements**:

- A **maximum of 6 jump elements**, consisting only of jumps but can include a single Axel and double jumps, excluding double flip, double Lutz and double Axel. Must include at least one jump combination or sequence of jumps, but not more than three in total. One jump combination could consist of up to three jumps; the other two combinations must only consist of two jumps each. Any solo jump can be repeated only once and this repetition must be done either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.
- A **maximum of three (3) spins of different abbreviations**, one of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one must be a flying spin. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for a flying spin with no change of foot after landing; four (4) for a spin with only one position and no change of foot; four (4) for the spin combination with no change of foot and eight (4+4) for the spin combination with a change of foot.
- A **maximum of one (1) step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) or spiral sequence** fully utilising the ice surface (may include spirals, free skate movements, steps and turns).

## OPEN (equivalent to ISA's Elite/Professional Division)

Duration: must not exceed 3 minutes 10 seconds.

A well-balanced **OPEN** programme must contain a **maximum of 11 elements**:

- A **maximum of seven (7) jump elements**, one of which must be an Axel type jump. Single, double or triple jumps are permitted. Must include at least one jump combination or sequence of jumps, but not more than three in total. One

jump combination could consist of up to three jumps; the other two combinations must only consist of two jumps each. Any solo jump can be repeated only once and this repetition must be done either in a jump combination or in a jump sequence.

- A **maximum of three (3) spins of different abbreviations**, one of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one must be a flying spin. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: five (5) for a flying spin with no change of foot after landing, five (5) for a spin with only one position and no change of foot; five (5) for the spin combination with no change of foot and eight (4+4) for the spin combination with a change of foot.
- A **maximum of one (1) step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) or spiral sequence** fully utilising the ice surface (may include spirals, free skate movements, steps and turns).

### *Ice Coverage*

Master's Cup events will be conducted on the full ice surface.

## ***ADULT SOLO INTERPRETATIVE TROPHY***

<b>Required Elements</b>	<b>Optional Elements</b>
<p>The Adult Solo Interpretative Trophy event is open to single skaters.</p> <p>No technical elements are required to be performed but are not prohibited as long as they are appropriate to the music.</p> <p>Skaters who compete in this division may also participate in the Adult Team Interpretative Trophy division.</p>	<p><i>Adult Solo Interpretative Trophy</i> competitors are not required to perform any technical elements, but are not prohibited from doing so.</p> <p>However, skaters are not allowed to perform any double or triple jumps in this division. The highest level jump which may be performed is an axel.</p> <p>Performances will be judged on the quality of choreography, musical interpretation and entertainment value.</p>

### ***Time Limit***

Minimum: 1 minutes 20 seconds

Maximum: 3 minutes

### ***Ice Coverage***

This event will be conducted on the full ice surface.



- ❖ If something unexpected happens during your performance (eg. faulty music or loose lace or blade), go straight to the Referee (most senior judge) who will deal with the problem.

There are 4 categories to choose from. These age groups will run regardless of the number of entries.

**Solo 18 – 25**

**Solo 26 – 40**

**Solo 41 – 55**

## ***ADULT TEAM OR PAIR INTERPRETATIVE TROPHY***

<b>Required Elements</b>	<b>Optional Elements</b>
<p>The Adult Team Interpretative Trophy event is open to pairs, groups or precision teams of any level.</p> <p>No technical elements are required to be performed but are not prohibited as long as they are appropriate to the music.</p> <p>Skaters may not participate in more than one group program. There will be no restriction on the numbers of performers within each group entry.</p>	<p><i>Adult Interpretative Trophy</i> competitors are not required to perform any technical elements.</p> <p>Performances will be judged on the quality of choreography, musical interpretation and entertainment value.</p> <p>In the case of a Group performance, good teamwork and synchronisation will be looked for.</p>

### ***Time Limit***

Minimum: 2 minutes

Maximum: 3 minutes 30 seconds

### ***Ice Coverage***

This event will be conducted on the full ice surface.

## ***ADULT DANCE INTERPRETIVE***

<b>Required Elements</b>	<b>Optional Elements</b>
<p>The Adult Dance Interpretative Trophy event is open to dance couples of any level.</p> <p>No technical elements are required to be performed but are not prohibited as long as they are appropriate to the music. Compulsory Dances may be performed at the competitors discretion.( this would be instead of a free program)</p> <p>Skaters may not participate in more than one group program.</p>	<p><i>Adult Interpretative Trophy</i> competitors are not required to perform any technical elements.</p> <p>Performances will be judged on the quality of choreography, musical interpretation and/or execution of a compulsory dance (if this is chosen as your program) and entertainment value.</p>

### ***Time Limit***

Minimum: 1 minutes 20 seconds

Maximum: 3 minutes

### ***Ice Coverage***

This event will be conducted on the full ice surface.

## ***SOLO DANCE INTERPRETIVE***

<b>Required Elements</b>	<b>Optional Elements</b>
<p>The Adult Solo Dance Interpretative Trophy event is open to Solo dancers of any level.</p> <p>The theme for this solo dance event will be the Tango. Create your own original pattern to music of your own choosing. Artistic elements and moves may be added.</p> <p>Skaters may only compete in 1 interpretive solo event and 1 technical event.</p>	<p><i>Adult Interpretative Trophy</i> competitors are not required to perform any technical elements.</p> <p>Performances will be judged on the quality of choreography, musical interpretation and/or execution of a compulsory dance (if this is chosen as your program) and entertainment value.</p>

### ***Time Limit***

Minimum: 1 minutes 20 seconds

Maximum: 3 minutes

### ***Ice Coverage***

This event will be conducted on the full ice surface.

## ***Scoring***

---

**Closed marking will be used.**

The Masters Cup Divisions are judged the same way as a free skating program using IJS hence there is a Technical Score and a Program Component Score that is calculated by a complex computer system.

The key elements of presentation are reflected by the Program Components and scores in the Adult Interpretive Trophy will be based on Skating skills; Transitions; Performance/Execution; Choreography/Composition and Interpretation.

***The Adult Interpretative Trophy*** events are judged by non-skating judges on the basis of artistic merit/entertainment value.

***Note 1***

*In the case of a draw, the highest program component score will break the tie*

***Note 2***

*Judges will take into account optional elements only to the extent that the use of such elements adds to the overall artistic presentation of the program.*

*Skaters will be rewarded for artistry, and the presentation of required elements, rather than simply ranked on the number of jumps and spins completed within the program.*
